Undefeated fighters Kent Cruz and Darius Ervin collide in top undercard bout on Saturday night in Fort Washington, Maryland

Fort Washington, Maryland (November 4, 2016)—A pair of Undefeated junior welterweight's collide in a top undercard as Kent Cruz (11-0, 6 KO's) takes on Darius Ervin (3-0) as part of a big night of boxing Saturday night at the Rosecroft Raceway in Fort Washington, Maryland.

The card which is promoted by King's Promotions, will feature undefeated junior welterweight Mykal Fox battling Juan Rodriguez in the eight-round main event.

The 23 year-old Cruz is coming off his biggest win to date, when he scored 8 round unanimous decision over previously undefeated Rickey Edwards on September 3rd in San Antonio.

The St. Louis native is ready for another win over an undefeated opponent.

"Camp went great. I had great sparring and just good training for this bout," said Cruz."I know Ervin is tall and rangy and likes to work from the outside."

Cruz started to generate a little buzz after his win over Edwards and he became a name on some prospect lists.

"I got good feedback after that win. It was a great win to showcase my skills, and coming back so quick is good as I need

to stay busy.”

Even though it was an impressive performance in the NBC Sports Network televised fight, Cruz believes he could have been even better against Edwards.

“I felt I could have stopped him. What I learned in that fight is when I get a fighter hurt and I need to finish him. I should have worked the body more and I could have stopped him.”

With a win on Saturday night, Cruz sees himself making a big move in 2017.

“I am hoping for big things next year. I am looking to get in the mix for a regional title, which will get me ranked and just stay active.”

Ervin, who is originally from Charlotte, North Carolina but now calls Los Angeles home is not in the least awed by Cruz’s big win over Edwards.

“My camp went well. I took this fight on short notice, but that isn’t a big deal. We stay ready, so we don’t have to get ready. Cruz is a decent fighter, but no disrespect, I do not feel he is on my level. I just focus on what I have to do in there and not focus on him. I am on weight and ready to go,”said Ervin.

Ervin is a strong minded fighter, who knows what a win can do for him.

“I am self motivated. He fought a good fighter in his last fight,, but he didn’t fight me. He doesn’t have my skills. Signing with King’s Promotions has given me motivation and I thank them for the opportunity. I don’t care what anybody’s record is, because I am in the gym everyday and I stay in shape. Weather I have a fight or not, I am always fine tuning and staying in shape. I am the King and I am ready to defend

my throne. I just know I am going to bring my best and I hope he brings his.”

Also in attendance at Tuesday’s workout was undefeated rising prospect Omar Douglas, who battles former world champion Javier Fortuna in PBC on Spike action that same night.

Televised coverage on Spike begins at 9 p.m. ET/8 p.m. CT and features undefeated rising star Jarrett Hurd against former title challenger Jo Jo Dan in a super welterweight attraction.

Here is what the participants had to say Tuesday:

DANNY GARCIA

"It feels great to be fighting at home. This is what Philadelphia needed. We're a fight town. I feel like people don't know that all over the world. We have a great history and a lot of world champions from here, and they've been kind of been overshadowed. It's an honor to be able to bring a fight back to these fans.

"It's very important to give back. I'm so happy to have the opportunity. With Thanksgiving and Christmas around the corner I'm sure we'll be making a big impact. There are a lot of families in Philadelphia who really need it and I'm glad I can help.

"I'm very lucky to be where I am. It takes a lot of hard work, but you also need the right timing. My dad and I had a vision. We never gave up on that vision. We've been through so much in life, we didn't want to stop till we reached our goals.

"The city of Philadelphia needs a champion. They need someone to give them a hometown show. There's a lot of excitement with the Eagles and Sixers right now, and I'm going to give them another thing to cheer for.

"It's a very short trip for me to the arena so I'm happy about that. I feel comfortable. I'm in my own backyard. We're planning to make sure Vargas is very uncomfortable.

"I love seeing these young kids from Philadelphia on the card.

I love giving them an opportunity to get fights in front of their hometown fans too. There are a lot of doors opening up for young fighters from Philadelphia and I love that I can be a part of it.

"I know Billy Briscoe (Vargas' trainer) will have some tricks. We're very familiar with each other and I know what kind of trainer he is. He's never prepared to face someone like me.

"I've watched the tape on Vargas. He's a gritty fighter. He's definitely a tough guy who won't give up. I have to be ready. I'm going to have to be prepared. I feel ready to go.

"I had to grow into 140-pounds before I started knocking people out. This will be my third fight at welterweight and I think I'm going to feel as good as I have in my career. That's why we're ready to take on the best."

OMAR DOUGLAS

"This is just a task. I've been preparing for this moment all my life. Ever since I was eight-years-old. Not to take anything away from Fortuna, but he's a gatekeeper in the division. I have to get through him to get to what I want.

"Camp has been camp. It's rough at times but it's part of the process. I embrace it all though. I love being in camp. I'm bored when I'm not at camp so I'm definitely happiest when I'm in the gym.

"My weight is on point and on target. We're just slowing it down and getting ready to make sure I'm peaking on fight night.

"Being able to fight in Philadelphia means the world to me. This is where I started my boxing career. I've been coming up the highway from Delaware to fight since I was a kid. Now a win here can propel me to another level.

"Fortuna is where I want to be at. I want to get through him.

I can't look past him. I'm focused on Javier Fortuna and writing another chapter in my story.

"You can expect a very exciting fight on November 12. Hopefully he's everything that people claim he is. I know that I am and I'm definitely going to come out on top."

ANGEL GARCIA, Danny's Father & Trainer

"There are people in this country who don't have food. My parents were farmers when they came to this country. When I was a child I was hungry. I ran around with no shoes and I wore my brother's clothes. The first thing Danny and I do when we get in the ring is say a prayer and bow our heads for the kids in the world with nothing to eat. I always told Danny and my family to appreciate whatever we have gotten. We're using our position now to make a difference.

"Danny is completely ready for this fight. He's healthy and on track to make weight. We'll be in the ring on November 12 and I think that if Samuel Vargas comes to fight and stands toe-to-toe with Danny, we're going to end the night early.

"We've brought in a lot of young prospects and guys with more experience for Danny to spar. I try to mix it up on Danny and keep him 100 percent ready. We can't take anything away from Vargas though. I know Danny is a very talented fighter and he gives me what I want. He's always learning.

"We don't watch a lot of tape. My job is not to watch the opponent, it's to train Danny Garcia. You can't forget about what your fighter does well.

"These are big things for Danny. He's the champion and he should be on exciting cards like this. We're looking to keep building and building his career.

"We're keeping Danny focused. He knows that he can't underestimate anybody. We take every opponent very seriously.

The 32 people that he fought before were taken just as seriously as Vargas. We don't change anything or take anything away. I make sure his circle is tight and that camp is focused.

"I'm happy because headlining in Philadelphia is Danny's dream. What makes Danny happy makes me happy. That's what it's about at the end of the day."

Mykal Fox ready for Juan Rodriguez on Saturday, November 5th at Rosecroft Raceway in Fort Washington, Maryland

Fort Washington, Maryland (October, 28, 2016)—Undefeated junior welterweight prospect

Mykal "The Professor" Fox is ready for his next challenge against veteran Juan Rodriguez in an eight-round bout that will headline eight-bout on Saturday, November 5th at the Rosecroft Raceway in Fort Washington, Maryland.

The card is promoted by King's Promotions.

Fox of Forestville, Maryland has a record of 11-0 with three knockouts and this will be his fourth bout of 2016.

The 20 year-old Fox turned professional in 2014 and has been kept busy as this will be his 12th contest in 29 months.

In his last bout, Fox stopped Somner Martin in three rounds on August 19th in Washington, DC.

Fox has been working hard in camp with his father/trainer Troy.

"Camp is winding down, and it has been real good. Coming off my last win, I got right back in camp. I took a week off and I all that I had to do was get in fight shape," said Fox.

When trying to scout Rodriguez, Fox was not able to get much information, but he will be ready for what the veteran has to offer.

"I could not find anything on him. I just have to go in there and be the best of me."

At just 21 years-old (Turned 21 today) Fox continues to mature physically, and the improvement is evident in his performances.

"As long as I learn something from every fight, I am happy. My power is coming around and I would not consider myself a knockout puncher, but it's getting better. People forget, I turned pro at age 18, and now I think my power has become respectable."

This being his 12th fight and most likely last of 2016, Fox sees 2017 as a moving year in his career.

"In 2017 I am looking for big things. I just want to keep winning and get some television time, but I know for that to

happen, I must get past Rodriguez on November 5th. Just remember that main event Myke is coming to a boxing ring near you."

Rodriguez of Haymarket, Virginia has a record of 6-5-1 with five wins coming via stoppage.

The 26 year-old Rodriguez is an eight year professional and he won his first four fights. He has a fifth round stoppage win over previously undefeated Nathaniel Rivas (5-0).

Fox will be Rodriguez' fourth undefeated opponent. Rodriguez is coming off a six-round unanimous decision defeat to Anthony Young (11-2) on April 29th in Atlantic City.

Javier Fortuna vs. Omar Douglas Camp Notes

PHILADELPHIA (October 27, 2016) – Former world champion Javier Fortuna (30-1-1, 22 KOs) and undefeated rising contender Omar Douglas (17-0, 12 KOs) are set to meet in a pivotal matchup as both men look to make a statement when they meet on Saturday, November 12 from Temple University's Liacouras Center in Premier Boxing Champions on Spike action.

The former champion Fortuna and the unbeaten Douglas will meet in a 50-50 fight that could put the winner in a position to fight for a world title soon. Fortuna is known for his aggressive style while Douglas looks to impress against his toughest opponent to date.

Here is what the fighters had to say about training camp, each other and more:

How has training camp gone for this fight?

Javier Fortuna: "I'm having an excellent training camp. We're working hard and figuring out how to break down my opponent. Hector Bermudez does a great job and I'm very comfortable training here in Boston. I've gotten great sparring with guys like Will Madero and Alden Whatley. I'm going to be just as strong in the final round as I was in the first.

Omar Douglas: "Training has been going very well. I was already working and staying sharp, because I knew a big fight was on the horizon. Training in Delaware with Douglas Petitford has been great for me and I've had incredible sparring. I've been in there getting rounds with (2016 U.S. Olympian) Gary Antuanne Russell and a veteran in Hank Lundy."

What do you think of your opponent and how do you see this fight going stylistically?

JF: "Douglas is a prospect who has looked pretty good coming up. He wants to get to where I've been. He might be looking past me. I think that his style my style perfectly. I'm going to have openings and I just need to take advantage."

OD: "Fortuna is a very decent and explosive fighter. He's a

former world champion and I expect him to stand up and get back what he thinks is his. He wants his rematch with Sosa and we are in each other's way. He's a frontrunner in the ring. He will try to start strong and I am prepared for whatever he brings to the table. Whether he boxes or fights me. I will make adjustments."

What kind of problems does your opponent pose?

JF: "The only problem that he will pose is if he doesn't show up and fight. I'm ready for anything he can bring, so I hope he's ready to give the fans a show."

OD: "He moves well. I can't let myself get off-balanced trying to chase him. He's awkward but I know that my jab will neutralize his strengths."

What are you looking for in the future if you can get the win on November 12? What are your goals for 2017?

JF: "I want to fight the best that are out there. My first choice is a rematch with Jason Sosa so that I can win my belt back. I'd love to fight Vasyl Lomachenko. I don't think he's fought a guy quite like me yet."

OD: "I want to fight for a world title. That's the goal. He is a former champion who just lost his title and 2017 is my year to make a run for a title."

How have you improved as a fighter since your loss? Do you believe a win over Douglas proves you're still one of the best in the division?

JF: "I have learned a lot of things since I lost. My defense and my confidence in myself has improved. If I can beat a guy who is 22-0 and make it two wins over previously unbeaten fighters, then I think I'm right back in contention. He's still considered a prospect so I think whoever wins will be a contender at the top of the division."

How does fighting in Philadelphia motivate you, having fought there in the amateurs and being from nearby Delaware?

OD: "In the amateurs I was one of the only guys from Delaware. I had a lot of obstacles. I've been fighting against Philly's best fighters for years. Philadelphia is where I achieved my first goals in the sport and it will always be special to me to fight in Philly."

Why do you believe you'll be victorious on fight night?

JF: "With the work that I've been putting in, I know that I will be ready on fight night. I've been through too much not to leave the ring victorious."

OD: "I've been waiting for this moment for all my life and I believe I am the hungrier fighter. He doesn't want it as badly as I do. I've been waiting in the shadows for a long time. I have all the skills necessary to get the job done."

Hurd’s blinding right uppercut in the first round sent Molina to the canvas and the highlight earned him a spot on SportsCenter’s Top 10 Plays.

(On his team): I have the best team in the world. Ernesto Rodriguez is my head trainer and we do our work in Temple Hills, Maryland. Ernesto is great because he trains me for the style that fits my skills best.

(Favorite sport/team): I watch football. I only the watch the Washington Redskins though. I've always been a huge fan.

(Favorite television show): Power on Starz

(Favorite movie): Deadpool

(Favorite junk food): Pizza

(Favorite health food): Kale

(Celebrity crush): Keri Hilson and Nia Long

(Perfect Vacation): Definitely a cruise to Puerto Rico. I've never been there but I want to experience it.

(On his homemade " All Access " videos): I just love to be out there and giving fans a chance to feel connected to me. My childhood friend, Christopher Walton, picked up a camera and just started recording me in the ring and outside of the ring one day. He started getting some better equipment so we

decided to do these videos to help promote me. The fans are important to me and I want them to feel like they're a part of my journey.
